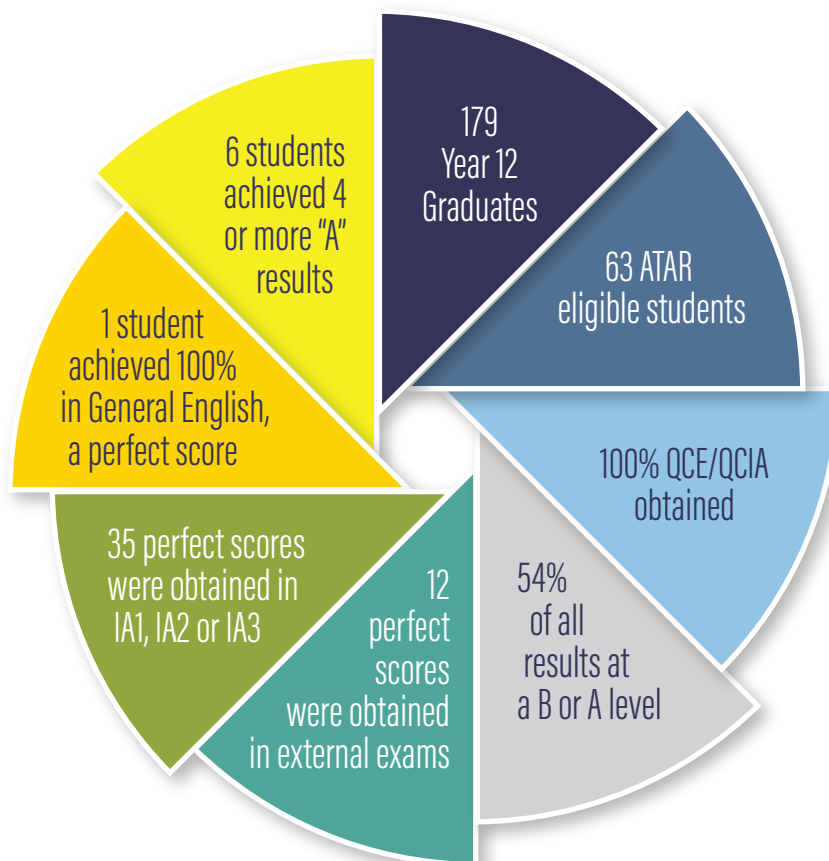


Great Results in 2022

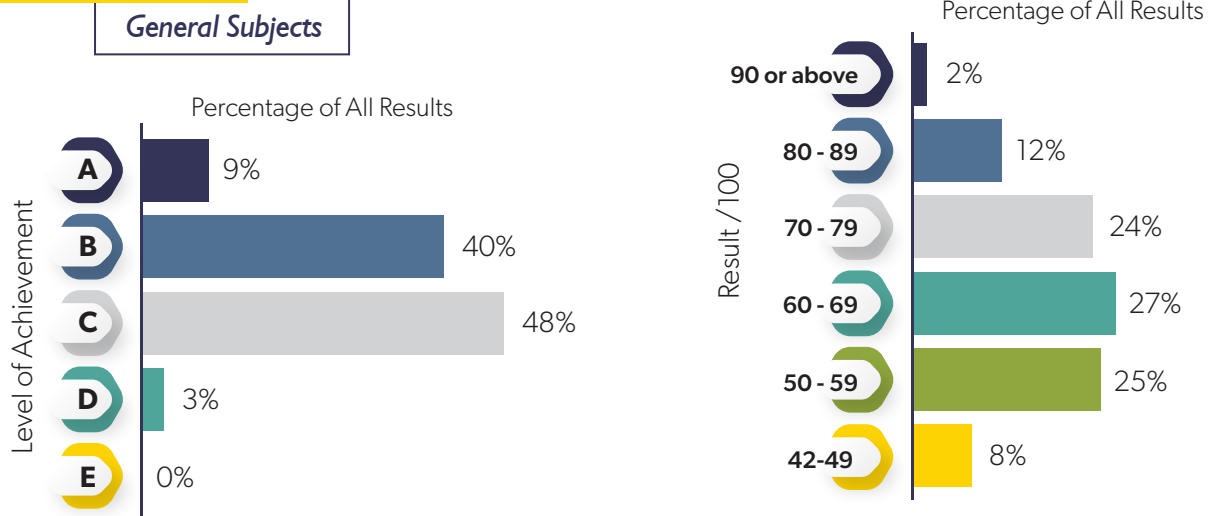

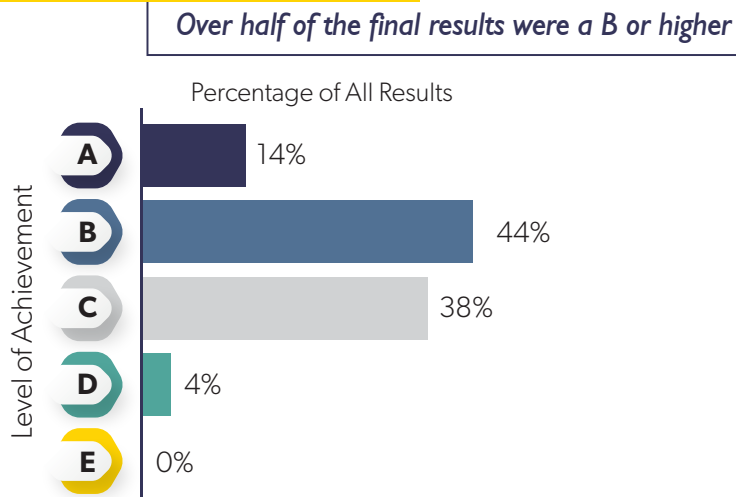

Subject Results

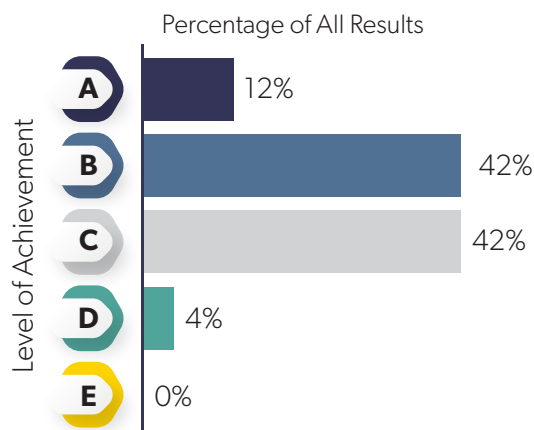


Applied and Applied Essential Subjects



All Subject results

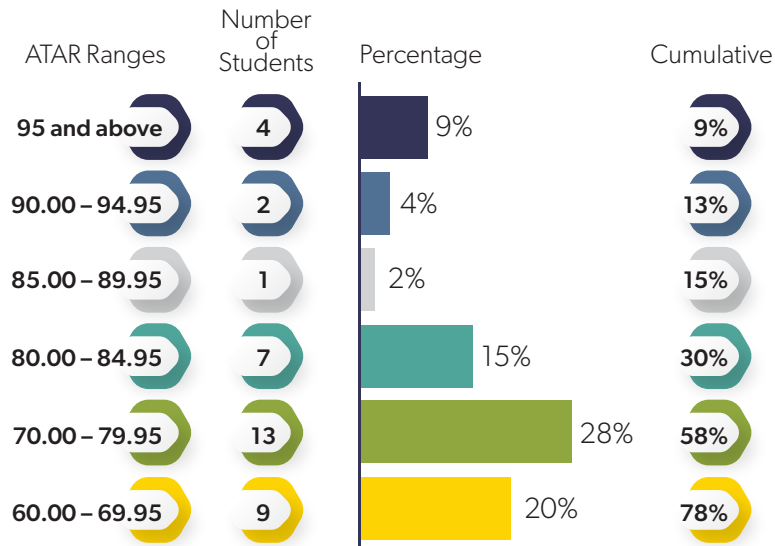
General, Applied and Applied Essential Subjects



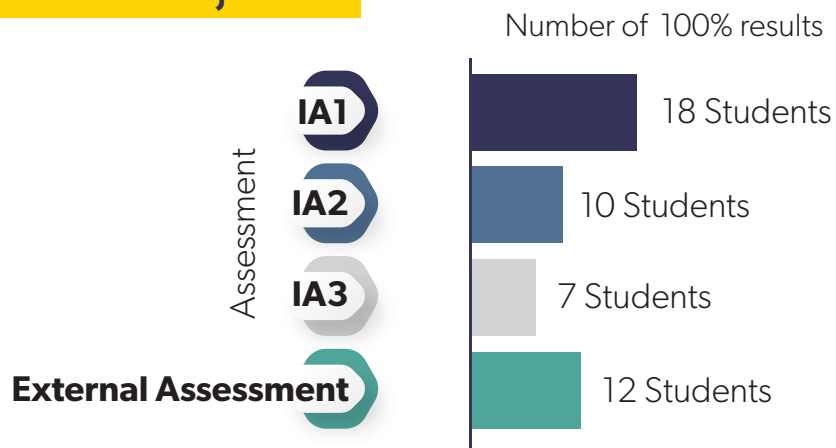
ATAR Results

Where do our Graduates go?

Both ATAR and non ATAR pathway students can apply through QTAC during year 12. 48 offers were made across December and January to our students.

35 first preference offers were made. This means that 73% of all offers were to students' top preference. 84% of offers were to first and second preferences for our students.

Top Institutions were Griffith University with, 33% of all offers, followed by Queensland University of Technology (QUT), at 27%.

The most common fields of study were Science (Sport and Exercise Science & Biomedical Science), Health (Occupational Therapy and Nursing), Education (Primary, Secondary or Early Childhood) and Engineering.
