Ormeau Woods State High School will receive**

\$487,961*

This funding will be used to

- Improve student growth in NAPLAN from years 7-9 to be better than the national average
- Improve U2B scores in all NAPLAN domains in both Years 7 and 9
- Improve the percentage of all students receiving a C grade or better across all subject areas to 92%
- Improve the percentage of students in all year levels receiving an A grade to 20%
- Improve the percentage of ATAR students receiving an ATAR score of 65 or better to 80%
- Improve whole school attendance percentage to 92%

Our initiatives include

- Testing all students upon enrolment at the school to establish literacy and numeracy capabilities
- Reviewing student performance data at regular intervals to identify areas for priority support
- Providing time for teaching teams and PLT's to meet to collaboratively assess, prioritise, plan, monitor and review student performance.
- Employing additional staff to collaboratively work with teaching teams to embed Reading and Writing teaching strategies as well as targeted intervention and enrichment strategies for Literacy and Numeracy.
- Employing additional staff to collaboratively develop and implement a Response to Need (R2N) strategy to ensure Ormeau Woods State High School is implementing Inclusive practice across the school.
- Targeted professional development to enhance expert teaching teams
- Employing additional staff to implement the school's Responsible Thinking Process and Positive Behaviour for Learning to enhance the school learning culture.
